

**Town of Grant – Annual Meeting**  
**Tuesday, April 18, 2023**  
**Grant Town Hall – 7:00 p.m.**

The annual meeting of the Town of Grant was held on Tuesday, April 18, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. at the Grant Town Hall, Caroline, Wisconsin. Twenty-three residents, guests, and board members were in attendance. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Richard Britzke and began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the 2022 annual meeting were read. A motion was made by Alan Breitenfeldt and seconded by Ken Huebner to approve the minutes as read. The motion was approved unanimously.

The annual report was presented for discussion. There was a question on the election expenses. A motion was made by Alan Breitenfeldt and seconded by Joanne Kostlevy to accept the annual report. The motion was approved unanimously.

**Old Business**

A question was asked about the dam inspection process. The dam is due for inspection in 2028.

**New Business**

Garbage Collection: GFL Environmental will be the new garbage collector for the Town of Grant, starting June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. The town received several complaints from residents about the current garbage collector, Harter's Fox Valley Disposal.

Playground Equipment at the Town Hall: The playground equipment was donated by the Caroline Aces 4-H Club. The 4-H Club will take care of the installation and hope to have the equipment up by June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Tree on the Telephone Wire: There was a question asked about when the tree that was on the telephone wire would be taken care of. The wire is a Frontier phone line. Frontier said they would take care of it, but they never did.

Playground Equipment at the Ballpark: The baseball team is looking for help with purchasing a playground system for \$6500. The baseball team will take care of ordering and installing the equipment. The playground equipment will be placed along the 3<sup>rd</sup> base side. A motion was made by Ken Huebner and seconded by Joanne Kostlevy for the town to contribute \$3500 from the COVID Fund to help with the cost of the playground equipment. Motion carried unanimously. The ball team is also looking into purchasing netting to help protect the audience from foul balls.

Brushing: There was a question asked about brushing on Gerbig Road. There were maple and cedar trees on personal property that were damaged. There was also a mess left on the lawn of

the property. There is no protocol on notifying residents when brushing will be done. The town right away is 24 ½ feet from the center line of the road or 49 feet total on roadways.

Wages: A motion was made by James Radtke and seconded by Joanne Kostlevy to keep part-time wages at \$20.00 per hour. The motion was approved unanimously.

Solar Farms: A question was asked if there was any more information on the solar farms. The town board has not been provided with anymore information on the solar farms. Residents are still receiving letters asking about their interest in solar farms on their property.

Annual meeting date: A motion was made by Dale Mielke and seconded by Tony Wudstrack to hold the 2024 annual meeting at the Grant Town Hall on Tuesday April 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. The motion was approved unanimously.

County 10-year Comp. Plan: Ken Huebner talked about the 10-year zoning comp. plan that was due for the county. Currently most of the Town of Grant is in Farmland Preservation. Residents stated they would like to keep it that way.

Liquor License Approval: A motion was made by Bill Bowers and seconded by Dale Klitz to approve liquor, cigarette, and operator's licenses for The Caroline Legion LLC. Motion carried.

Adjourn: A motion was made by Troy Malueg and seconded by Tony Wudstrack to adjourn the meeting at 7:59 pm. The motion was approved unanimously.
